200 FLOOD VICTIMS IN NYAMWARE FED

The area of Nyamware was also greatly affected by floods. About 200 people are living in a school, homes destroyed with nowhere to go to. Through your support we were able to give 10 bags of maize (48,000 shillings) to these flood victims. We distributed food at a nearby home to avoid any food rushes. We partnered with VOSH church who gave clothes to the flood victims. Through your support these people have had enough to push them for two weeks. They were in a very desperate situation.

RESTRUCTURING THE LIFE OF INDIVIDUALS FARMERS WHO LOST THEIR CROPS TO FLOODS IN NYANDO



The village elder from the assistant Chef's office in Ahero mobilized 40 smallholder farmers who grow vegetables for their livelihood. The flooding destroyed all their crops and they have been suffering. Most of them have been looking for food support and reconstructing their flooded homes. Kitanda project supported the farming community

with various farm inputs.

Each household was given a package of farm inputs containing; kale, Amaranth, onions, tomatoes, spinach, eggplant and melons. One package per household was KES. 2500/= x 40 households =, A total of KES. 100,000/=. Ruth Orlale training conducted a socioeconomic survey on farmers needs and also trained them on basic principles of farming
